TOPHER'S WEEKLY LESSON

In the Bible, in the Book of 1 Samuel, there were two friends named David and Jonathan who loved each other very much. David was a mighty warrior who defeated the giant Goliath. Everyone loved David except for one person. King Saul didn't like David because the people loved David more than him. That made King Saul very mad at David. FRIENDS WHO LOVE (Response to God Activity)

Supplies: GO! Home Guide (printed on back of coloring sheet, 1 per child), crayons

Question: What was your favorite part of today's story? Why did you like that part?

Directions: Give each child a GO! Home Guide and some crayons or markers. The sheet will have a space for children to draw. Tell the children to draw and decorate a heart. While the children are drawing, have them tell about a friend who loves them. Ask them what their friend does to show them love.

Say: God gave David a friend who loved him. He gives us friends who love us too! Let's say a prayer and thank God for giving us the friends we talked about.

Prayer: Begin by asking if any of the children would like to pray. Allow any children who want to pray the opportunity to do so. When they're finished, close the prayer by thanking God for the friends that were mentioned.
