ACTIVITY: JULY 26, 2020

BE KIND (Response to God Activity)

Supplies: GO! Home Guide (printed on back of coloring sheet, 1 per child), crayons

Question: Why do you think Boaz was so kind to Ruth?

Directions: Give each child a GO! Home Guide and some crayons or markers. The sheet will have a space for children to draw. Tell the children to draw a BIG smiley face. As the children draw, ask them to share one kind act they can do this coming week.

Say: Look at your picture. When we are kind to people, that's what they look like. They are so, so happy. Let's say a prayer and tell God about the kind things we're going to do this week.

Prayer: Begin by asking if any of the children would like to pray. Allow any children who want to pray the opportunity to do so. When they're finished, close the prayer by telling God about some of the kind things the children shared. Ask God to help the children do those kind things.
