During this season, we want to start preparing our hearts in anticipation for the arrival of our King, Jesus! As you celebrate the season, add a sticker to the Advent Calendar after you finish each day's activity. You'll begin by creating an Advent wreath ornament. Each week, you'll add a new piece to your wreath and the finished product will be fully decorated. Follow along each day in this activity book for instructions.

# Week One HOPE

"Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" Matthew 1:23

November 29- Advent Sunday

#### <u>Make the Wreath</u>

This week, you'll make the basic wreath using the wire hoop, the hanger, and the evergreen decoration. This Christmas season, you can take a few minutes each day to make Christ the focus of your conversation.

Materials: - ring, evergreen, name tag with ribbon

<u>**Instructions:**</u> Wrap the evergreen around the wire structure. Add the ribbon tag with your child's name on it to the ornament. Hang the ornament on your tree, in your window, or on your refrigerator.

<u>Conversation Focus</u>: In the dark winter months, evergreens are a sign of hope—that spring will soon return. Every year, we celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas time. Even in difficult times, we celebrate the hope we have in Jesus.

**Open the Bible and read:** Matthew 1:23


November 30-Pray to the God of hope.

*Family Prayer Time:* Open your Bible and read Matthew 1:23.

<u>Say:</u> Immanuel (or Emmanuel) means God with us. We know that God cares about us. What are your prayer requests? Let's thank God that He is with us and pray for these requests. Pray with your family.

#### <u>Make a prayer chain:</u>

- Use the green paper to write words of praise to God.
- Use the red paper to write the names of your neighbors and other people for whom you are praying.

Now, staple each strip linking the pieces together into a chain, and hang it somewhere in your house to remind you to praise God and to pray for others.

#### <u>Shrinky Dink Cross</u>

This week, you'll make a Shrinky Dink cross. If you haven't done this before, it may be helpful to watch a short video about baking your Shrinky Dink plastic. You'll need to punch a hole (with a hole punch) before you bake the plastic.

<u>Materials</u>: Shrinky Dink cross, colored pencils and/or Sharpies, a small wire to attach the cross to the ornament

**Instructions:** Preheat the oven to 325 degrees Fahrenheit. Punch a hole in the top of the cross. Write the word Love on the cross with a Sharpie or a dark colored pencil, and color the plastic as you like. Place the cross on a piece of foil and put it on a baking sheet. Bake the shape for about 1-3 minutes. At first, the Shrinky Dink will curl up, but then it will flatten back out. Once it is flattened back out, bake for 30 more seconds. Remove from the oven. Place the small wire through the hole and attach it to the wreath

ornament you made in week one.

<u>Conversation Focus</u>: Jesus was born in a manger and died on a cross. This doesn't seem like good news, but God's plan was perfect. God loved us so much that He sent His only son to save us from our sins when we put our faith in Jesus.

**Open the Bible and read:** Matthew 1:21



<u>Family Prayer Time:</u> Open your Bible and read Matthew 1:21.

<u>Say:</u> Jesus came to earth to make a way for people to turn away from their sins. This shows us how much God loves us. What are your prayer requests? Let's pray for these requests.

Pray with your family. Pray for God to help you love others the way He loves us.

# Week Three JOY

### December 13

**<u>Angel</u>**: Make a paper angel to attach to the wreath ornament.

<u>Materials</u>: Angel Ornament sheet in supply packet, scissors, string (optional - crayons and glitter)

**Instructions**: Cut out the angel ornament on the heavy lines. Decorate the ornament if you like. Lock the wings at the slots to create the paper angels. Add the string to the top of the angel head. Attach the angel to the wreath ornament.

**Conversation Focus:** Angels brought the good news of Jesus' birth to the shepherds. They glorified God.

#### Open the Bible and read: Luke 2:8–15



#### <u>Family Prayer Time:</u>

Open your Bible and read Luke 2:8—15.

<u>Say:</u> This week we are talking about joy. Let's celebrate together by talking about the good news the angels brought to the shepherds. Why is it good news of great joy?

Pray with your family. Pray for God to help you share joy with someone this week.

#### <u>White Feather</u>

<u>Materials</u>: white feather, wire to attach the feather, dove sticker from the calendar

*Instructions:* Attach the feather to the wreath. Show the child the dove sticker.

<u>Conversation Focus</u>: A dove is very special. In the Bible it is a symbol of peace. Jesus is called the Prince of Peace.



#### Open the Bible and read: Isaiah 9:6





<u>Family Prayer Time:</u> Open your Bible and read Isaiah 9:6.

Say: This week we are talking about peace. When people are fighting, we can help bring peace. How do you help bring peace?

Pray with your family. Pray for peace as we think about our world.
