## TOPHER'S WEEKLY LESSON

In the Bible, in the Book of Luke, Jesus walked to a village.

## ACTIVITY: MARCH 15, 2020

**TIME WITH JESUS** (Response to God Activity)

Supplies: GO! Home Guide (printed on back of coloring sheet, 1 per child), crayons

**Directions:** Give each child a GO! Home Guide and some crayons or markers. The sheet will have a space for children to draw. Tell the children to draw a picture of themselves reading the Bible. Or, for younger children, have them draw just the Bible. When finished, ask the children to show their pictures and tell what they love about the Bible.

**Say:** Jesus wants to spend time with you! One way you can spend time with Jesus is by reading His words in the Bible. Let's say a prayer and tell Jesus "thank you" for the Bible. We can tell Him what we love about the Bible, too.

**Prayer:** Begin by asking if any of the children would like to pray. Allow any children who want to pray the opportunity to do so. When they're finished, close the prayer by thanking Jesus for His words in the Bible.
