Ministry is still hectic - providing care packages, relief funds going to some of our mentors that have lost their jobs in this lockdown ... and trying to keep their mental health engaged by doing Zoom calls with those that have internet and coaching them to continue to grow and be in the Word during this time. We've even done workouts on Zoom to encourage their physical growth and health at this time too!

All that to say, we're making it. Praying for a miracle in the world and in South Africa so we can continue life and ministry SOON!
