We appreciate the prayers and thoughts and it's so good to know Shades is remembering us. All the schools have now closed, so we are home with all of our kids. We are figuring out homeschooling our children in a language that we don't speak. Pray that we have patience and are able to do this well, as well as have some fun family memories during this time. So far we are still free to leave the house for groceries, but we are under curfew from 6pm, and all restaurants and cafes must close at 4. The airport is shut down, so there is no way to get in our out. Although not many cases have been reported here, we are sure there are exponentially more because the ability to test for them is low. Our big concern is that a third world country like this won't be able to handle a huge outbreak like Italy or the US because the medical facilities and government are just not as strong as European countries or America. So, if things get bad here they could get very bad. We are praying that does not happen, and are looking for opportunities to use this as a way to share hope. Right now people are very scared here. While at the moment we can't have much interaction face to face with locals, we are keeping up with them via text and phone, looking for ways to love on others, and praying that after this is over we will have many opportunities to point to the Hope that we have! ~A & J, North Africa~

We are in a hotel with special permission. We are the only foreigners in the hotel and practically the only ones there. We fly out at 6 pm tomorrow and our next flight leaves at 3:40 am the following day. Our final counts were 500 gospel shares and 43 new believers in Hindu and Buddhist strongholds! Now our country has closed its doors to all foreigners for at least 2 weeks and the rest of her family is back in. Additionally we have multiple personnel in country whose visas are running out. They would usually leave for a few days to renew them, but now they can't get back in if they do. So there are some difficult decisions to be made in the next few days. The first person just died in our country from coronavirus and it was a pastor (not someone we knew but tragic nonetheless). In the midst of this, our team is trying to do what it can to continue to share the gospel at every opportunity and to help those most affected by things financially as well. So lift them up, for creative and safe ways to do those things. Thank you again for asking how y'all can pray! We appreciate that so much!
