





"Kinsman-Redeemer"

Ruth 3:1-18

If your family includes children of varying ages, consider rewording the questions to help your child better understand what's being asked.

- 1. The book of Ruth takes places during the time of the Judges when "everyone does what it right in his own eyes." But, we see clearly in Ruth 3 that godly character reaps rewards. When have you seen this in your own life?
- 2. What do you find beautiful about Jesus being humanity's Kinsman-Redeemer? Discuss related doctrines or biblical passages that come to your mind.
- 3. There's been a lot of injustice in the news over the last few weeks. How might the concept of kinsman-redeemer apply to how followers of Jesus relate to our neighbors?

IDEAS FOR LIVING SENT THIS WEEK

Think of a friend, neighbor, or family member who needs someone to help him or her through a tough time. Perhaps an elderly neighbor needs help with yard work.
