"Made in the Image of God" Ephesians 2:11-21

If your family includes children of varying ages, consider rewording the questions to help your child better understand what's being asked. We've included suggestions where appropriate!

- 1. Which of the four biblical principles for race relations seemed most significant to you?
- Where do you recognize your own sin of prejudice and/or racism? Repent of your sin with those who watched the service with you.
 - **Prejudice** means judging someone or having an idea about them before you actually know them. Prejudice is often directed toward people of a certain race or religion because they look or act differently.
 - **Racism** is the opinion or belief that some groups of people are better than others based on the color of their skin. Racism often leads to unfair treatment of people.
- 3. How will you work to raise your racial IQ in the next few weeks and months? [Suggested starting places include (1) education about races/ cultures and (2) exposure to people of a different race/ethnicity]
- 4. If you have children at home, what conversations can you have with them about diversity and race that wouldn't have happened before recent events?
