## "ARE YOU A DAY'S JOURNEY AWAY FROM GOD?" Luke 2:41-46

You can be a day's journey away from God due to:

I. NEGLECT (Luke 2:41-46)

*Luke* 2:41-46, "Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. <sup>42</sup>And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. <sup>43</sup>And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, <sup>44</sup>but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, <sup>45</sup>and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. <sup>46</sup>After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions."

## RESUME YOUR WALK WITH GOD: **RETRACE YOUR STEPS AND RETURN TO THE BASICS**

John 15:5, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing."

**II. WILLFUL DISOBEDIENCE (Jonah 1:3; 3:4)** 

Jonah 1:1-3 "Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before me." <sup>3</sup> But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD." 1. <u>Rebelling against God's moral commands</u>

James 3:17, "So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin."

2. Robbing God of tithes and offerings

Malachi 3:8, "Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me. "But you ask, 'How do we rob you?' "In tithes and offerings."

3. Running away from God's calling

## RESUME YOUR WALK WITH GOD: REPENT AND OBEY

Jonah 3:4-5, "Jonah began to go into the city, <u>going a day's journey</u>. And he called out, 'Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them."

## **III.DISCOURAGEMENT OVER LIFE'S SITUATIONS (I Kings** 19:3-4)

1 Kings 19:3-4, "Then he was afraid, and he arose and ran for his life and came to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there. But he himself <u>went a day's journey into the wilderness</u> and came and sat down under a broom tree. And he asked that he might die, saying, "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my fathers."
