"T-shirts and Underwear" Luke 2:8-12; Mark 2:1-12

I. Jesus is the gift that everyone needs, but He wasn't the gift that everyone wanted.

Luke 2:8-12

⁸ And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. ¹⁰ And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger."

Matthew 1:21, "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because <u>he will save his people from their sins."</u>

II. Jesus meets a deeper "need" that is greater than our "wants": forgiveness of sins

Colossians 2:13, "You were dead because of your sins and because your sinful nature was not yet cut away. Then God made you alive with Christ, for He forgave all our sins."

III. When God gives you what you need, He will change what you want.

Psalm 37:4, "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart."
